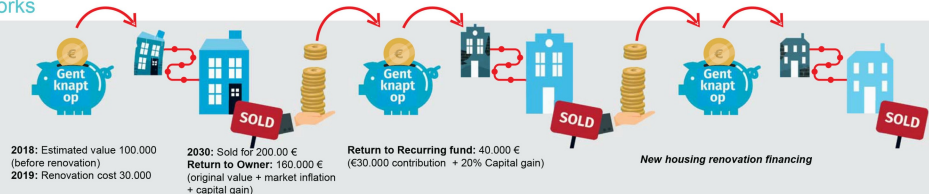

In particular the recurring fund is explained graphically in the attempt to help readers to observe the methodology of sustainable financial system.

RECURRING FUND | How it works

Ghent knap Op provides a maximum of 30,000 euros to renovate the house. Unlike traditional grants, no pre-financing is expected from the resident. This makes it possible for families with limited financial resources to structurally improve their living situation. Candidates only pay back the money when the property is sold. We then use that money to refurbish another house. This is called a rolling fund. It enables us to constantly renovate the homes of people who need it. Target groups: Captive residents, Elderly homeowners, Captive co-owners
